Have you ever wanted to study at colleges like Yale, Stanford, MIT or Brigham Young but thought they were too expensive or too far away? Well, now these colleges and dozens more are offering free courses online. They are not available for college credit but are perfect if you want to learn some new facts, brush up on some skills for your credit classes or want to test out a class. Through independent courses and open courseware programs, anyone with internet access can freely tap materials from about 5,000 courses at more than 150 colleges and universities around the world.

Independent courses are made exclusively for the internet. Although they do not offer the same amount of interaction as a credit course would, they have a nice set up and provide useful information on a wide range of topics. Brigham Young University has a number of independent courses available to the general public including genealogy and a number of religious courses. Stanford University offers free lectures, interviews, and material available for download on itunes, while www.free-ed.net has some free online textbooks available. Free-

ed.net also offers Information Technology programs that include step-by-step instructions on mastering computer skills.

Open courseware programs, designed for actual classrooms, give students around the world access to course materials actually used in university classrooms. Participating colleges, including Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and Yale University, post syllabi, assignments, calendars, lecture notes, readings, and other materials online. This method gives self-learners the opportunity to study the topic on their own terms.

While Yale only has 7 courses available at this time for the open courseware program, while MIT currently offers more than 1,000 courses. The only thing between you and over 5,000 college courses is an active broadband connection. Haviland Telephone offers 6MEG DSL service, which is a high speed broadband connection ideal for downloading or viewing the course materials offered from more than 150 colleges and universities around the world. Kansas One-Call: 1-800-DIG-SAFE

Putting in a fence and need to dig holes for the posts? Planting a tree or garden? Have an emergency and need to dig up your septic tank? Pick up the phone before you pick up the shovel! Call Kansas One-Call at 811 or 1-800-DIG-SAFE. Calling Kansas One-Call is the law if you are going to be doing any kind of digging for any reason. It is free to you to have lines or cables located. If you do not call and end up cutting a line or cable, the cost of repairing is up to you and can get very pricey. You'll need to provide the best location details you can, often the street or legal description of where you'll be working; when you'll be working; and what type of work you'll be doing. You need to call at least 2 days before work is scheduled to begin.

More CPNI News

As an extra precaution in protecting your account information, Haviland Telephone Company will be sending out letters of written confirmation when changes are made to your Customer Proprietary Network Information (CPNI) data. CPNI Changes that could generate this letter include: change of name or billing address on account, adding or changing CPNI passwords or hint questions, and using hint questions to gain access to CPNI data. In many cases two letters will be generated: one with the old information, and one with the new information. No action is required upon receiving these letters UNLESS changes have been made that you were not aware of. We will be sending these notifications out to help you become aware of, or remind you of, any changes that have been made.
