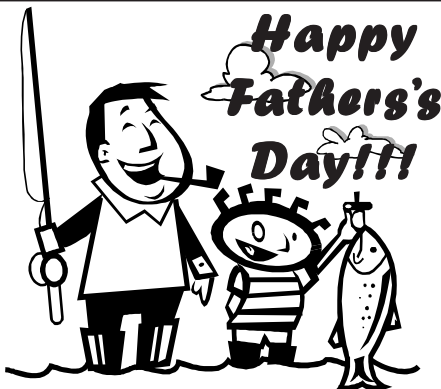


One of the most aggravating things after a storm is to pick up your phone and not have dial tone. Sometimes the problem is the phone line or a jack, other times it is electrical equipment or just a matter of things not being plugged in right. Below are some troubleshooters to try before calling the phone company.

1. Make sure all the phones are plugged into the phone jacks and are on the hook.
2. Unplug any cordless phones, answering or fax machines. If any of these have been hit by lightening or has a bad battery, and is plugged into a phone jack, NONE of the phones in the house will work. Also, when someone tries to call your number, they will get a busy signal. If you have DSL, you should still be able to get online.
3. If you have multiple jacks in the house but only one phone that is not working, try plugging that phone into a known working jack to see if the problem is the phone, or the jack.
4. If your DSL is not working try rebooting it. Turn off the modem and your computer and unplug the modem from the electrical outlet for about 30 seconds. Plug the modem back in and turn it on, then turn the computer back on and see if this fixes the problem.
5. If you have a phone and your DSL in a double jack, make sure they are plugged into the right ones. Your DSL will only work if it is plugged into the original jack.

Also remember it is a good idea to have a corded phone on hand in case of power outages, and always unplug your cordless phones, computer and modem from electrical outlets even if you have surge protectors.

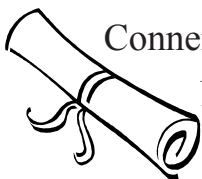
