## Abbreviated Dialing

Did you know that you can call into your local service provider by dialing only 3 numbers? Abbreviated dialing codes are short 3 digit numbers that allow access to special services. While 4-1-1 and 9-1-1 can be dialed from nearly anywhere to connect you to Directory Assistance and Emergency Services respectively, other short codes for dialing vary from place to place. Keep reading for information on which abbreviated dialing codes work within the Haviland Telephone Company (HTC) service area.

Dialing 2-1-1 from your landline phone will connect you with a local chapter of United Way located in either Dodge City or Wichita. By contacting United Way you can find help for mentoring, after-school programs, senior care, counseling, food pantries, disability services and more. You can also find organizations to volunteer for, donate or advocate.

United Way of America is based in Alexandria Virginia and works with nearly 1,300 local United Way offices throughout the country. The focus of United Way is identifying and resolving pressing community

issues, as well as making measurable changes in the communities through partnerships with schools, government agencies, businesses, organized labor, financial institutions, community development corporations, voluntary and neighborhood associations, the faith community and others.

The abbreviated dialing number for Directory Assistance is 4-1-1. Directory Assistance can find specific phone numbers and addresses for businesses and residences. Unpublished numbers and addresses are not available through the Directory Assistance. Also, there are charges for placing a call to Directory Assistance. Usually, the charge is \$.50 per call. These charges are billed on your local phone bill.

By dialing 5-1-1 from any landline or wireless phone in Kansas you can learn about road conditions, construction detours and travel weather information for the Kansas turnpike and any Interstate, US or state highway in Kansas and Nebraska. 5-1-1 should not be confused with 9-1-1. Any situation requiring police or highway patrol, fire department, ambulance or other

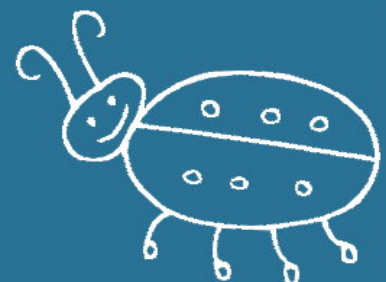

emergency services must be directed to 9-1-1.

Haviland Telephone Company can be reached by dialing 6-1-1 on your landline phone. You can use this number to contact us to make changes to your account, report phone troubles or with any questions or inquiries you might have. Dialing 6-1-1 from most cell phones will direct you to your cell phone provider. Usually you can pay your bill, get usage information or speak to a customer service representative.

The abbreviated dialing number for the Kansas Relay Center is 7-1-1. The Kansas Relay Center is a communication service that connects people who are deaf, hard of hearing or speech disabled that may use specialized telephone equipment to people who use standard telephones. An op-

erator assists with the call, relaying typed and spoken messages from one user to the other.

Dig Safe's abbreviated dialing number is 8-1-1. By contacting Dig Safe you can request to have underground lines marked before starting a digging project. Companies with buried lines must have a ticket from Dig Safe before doing any locating.

Probably the most recognized abbreviated dialing number is 9-1-1. 9-1-1 should be used only in emergencies when police, fire department or an ambulance is needed. 9-1-1 should NOT be called for information, to report power outages, pay a ticket or for pet emergencies.

These services can be accessed using your landline phone. If you have any questions or comments please contact our office at 6-1-1.
