Lifeline, Link

Lifeline is a government program that offers qualified low income households a discount on their monthly local telephone bill. The Link Up program helps households reduce the initial cost of setting up service by helping pay for activation fees. It does not, however, cover any of the cost of wiring inside your home. You are eligible for Link Up if you qualify for Lifeline.

You are eligible for Lifeline if your total household income is at or below 150% of the federal poverty level (see table below) or if you receive any of the following: Food Stamps, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, General Assistance, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, Administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Head Start (only those meeting its income qualifying standard), Free School Lunch Program.

You will be asked to provide proof of eligibility and to submit a form signed under

penalty of perjury that you receive benefits from, or a copy of any dated document which verifies your participation in one of the qualifying programs. Proof of total household income will be required for income based qualification. Your Lifeline benefits will take effect when eligibility is received.

Please keep in mind that being a Lifeline or Link Up customer does not protect you from being disconnected if you fail to pay your bill. Link Up only helps pay for the initial set up of service; if your phone is disconnected for non-pay, Link Up will not pay any portion of getting it reconnected. The discounts cannot be applied to an outstanding balance owed to your phone company. Lifeline can only be applied to ONE telephone per household.
